Emma received an Access to the Bar Award and a Jules Thorn Scholarship from Middle Temple, which made her career at the Bar a tangible possibility.

Emma is the Head of the Mentoring Programme at <u>Bridging the Bar (BTB)</u>. Bridging the Bar is a charity dedicated to diversifying the Bar's profile by creating opportunities for those from underrepresented backgrounds through mentorship, mini-pupillages, advocacy training, internships, marshalling and various other schemes.

Emma sits on the <u>Bar Council Race Working Group</u>, which produced the <u>Race Report 2021</u> addressing inequality at the Bar and proposing a series of recommendations for action.

Emma currently serves as the <u>Middle Temple Young Barrister's Association (MTYBA) Vice President</u> and was previously MTYBA Diversity and Inclusion Officer for two years, writing an <u>article on Black Lives Matter</u>. In her role as MTSA President in 2018, Emma organised and hosted the first <u>Black History Month Qualifying session</u>, which has now become an annual event.
