Amy has appeared in all levels of the family court and has appeared in cases involving allegations of non-accidental injury, substance misuse, domestic violence, mental health problems and emotional and physical abuse.

In November 2019 Amy (led by Tahmina Rahman) successfully resisted an appeal before the President of the Family Division in which the Court was asked to provide guidance on the duties of local authorities in care proceedings and in cases involving relinquished babies to notify fathers and wider families in cases where the mother objects.
